



By 06/30/2026, the school will improve the performance of students by demonstrating an overall increase to 80 % in attendance, as measured by the State Report Card.


By 06/30/2026, the school will improve the graduation rate of students by demonstrating an overall increase to 50 %, as measured by the State Report Card -**Graduation Rate**

Stark High School

Schools that receive the dropout prevention and recovery report card receive ratings for up to eight measures and four components.

Achievement Component

The Achievement component, previously called the High School Test Passage Rate component, represents sessments that are required for graduation

Progress

The Progress component looks closely at the growth all students are making during the school year

Gap Closing

This component shows how well schools are improving or meeting the performance expectations for all students in English language arts, math, graduation, and English language proficiency.



Standards

Graduation Rate

The Graduation Rate component looks at the percent of students who are successfully finishing high school with a diploma in four, five, six, seven or eight years.



Graduation Rates A Graduation rate is not calculated if there are not at least 10 students in the graduating class

- 18.9% of students graduated in 4 years
- 18.5% of students graduated in 5 years
- 15.5% of students graduated in 6 years
- 17.1% of students graduated in 7 years
- 15.2% of students graduated in 8 years
- 17.0% is the weighted average of all graduation rates
